



As a part of the Homeland Security Act of 2002, the Support Anti-Terrorism by Fostering Effective Technologies (SAFETY) Act was passed by Congress to encourage the development and deployment of anti-terrorism technologies that protect the nation. The SAFETY Act provides incentives for the development and deployment of anti-terrorism technologies by creating a system of "risk management" and a system of "litigation management." The purpose of the Act is to ensure that the threat of liability does not deter potential manufacturers or Sellers of anti-terrorism technologies and services from developing and commercializing specialist technologies that could save lives.

ELS has sought certifications that differentiate us within the Baggage Handling Systems and airport equipment maintenance industry and is Certified as a Qualified Service Provider for Anti-Terrorism Technology under the Safety Act. ELS has developed the highest levels of policy and procedure to exceed the requirements of the DHS in ensuring that its services are safe and effective in supporting anti-terrorism technologies.

What Does this Mean to Our Customers?

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security designation means our customers are protected under benefits of the Safety Act for all products and services offered by ELS and will not be liable for claims of damages associated with a terror-related incident. **This Standard of Excellence extends the designated protection to our contracted partners and is seen as significant value in terms of cost and risk limitation for any customer associated with the Airline Transportation Industry.**

The SAFETY Act provides 2 levels of liability protections to help promote the creation, deployment and use of anti-terrorism technologies:

DESIGNATION: The seller's liability for products or services that are deemed "Designated Technologies" is limited to the amount of liability insurance that the Department of Homeland Security determines the seller must maintain. Designation can also be obtained for promising anti-terrorism technologies that are undergoing testing and evaluation.

CERTIFICATION: In addition to the benefits provided under Designation, Certification allows a seller of an anti-terrorism technology to assert the Government Contractor Defense for claims arising from acts of terrorism. Technologies that receive Certification will be placed on DHS's Approved Products List for Homeland Security.
